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





教師發展日 (2018年4月11日)



本校教師發展組於 4月11日舉辦了本 學年第三次教師發展日,豐富教師的專 業知識。當天第一部份是「處理課堂違 規行爲」的經驗分享,由路德會西門英 才中學黃美琪助理校長主講,內容豐富 實用,均是她多年來處理不同個案的技 巧。第二部份由本校的尹國棟老師及陳 嘉盈老師分享電子教學方法。

隨著互聯網科技發展一日千里,電子教

學法也不再侷限於電腦簡報,已擴充應用至不同網絡工具,增添課 堂互動性。尹老師實踐「翻轉課堂」教學設計,3年多拍攝了200 多條教學影片及製作了400多張工作紙,供學生在家預習,然後在 課堂上集中討論研習難點,收窄了班級內的學習差異。陳老師則善 用網絡應用程式,通過在課堂上利用程式參與集體互動小測遊戲, 帶動學生的學習興趣,在講座中即席示範玩法,邀請在場老師參與,氣氛熱烈。

參與同學的感受分享

5E 張柏滇

在活動當天,我和其他同學先協助單位佈置場地,把物資分配到各個攤位的位置,負責人亦非常關心我們,不斷叫我們要小心點、不要勉強和記得使用推車搬運物資。然後,參與活動的中小學亦陸續到達,我們幫助了各攤位擺設展板,雖然過程中不太順利,例如有攤位要求更多展板,以及起初因不太熟悉操作以致差點受傷,但是幸好活動都尙算順利開始舉行。

經過了較忙碌的一段時間後,我就和長者談談天以及拍拍照,令我驚訝的是,在些長者十分熟悉現今年 青人所面對的考驗,他們都感歎孫兒考文憑試十分辛苦,更有人說即使大學畢業也很難找工作,世道艱難, 鼓勵我要加倍努力,真的有點驚喜和感動。最後活動接近尾聲,我們負責到各攤位截龍,以免不夠獎品分發, 而長者們都十分合作,相繼離開。這次活動帶給我不少經驗,包括活動流程以及和長者溝通等等,對較內向 的我增加了不少和別人交流的勇氣。

5E 郭靄琳

我們爲了「識飲識食少淸一盅兩件」的攤位做了不少準備工作,讓我們可以從長者的角度出發,設身處 地爲他們考慮,別具意義。例如要把後排的蒸籠疊高,方便長者看見,也能更輕易把玩偶投入。又如我們製 作的展板,起初我們的字體印得太小,經老師提醒後我們才驚覺長者視力不佳,我們應放大字體,方便他們 閱讀。

我們平常以自己的角度看待事物,往往忽略了長者的需要。這次活動讓我明白到老人家受身體的局限, 很多事情他們都力有不逮,我們更應考慮他們的需要,耐心地爲他們提供幫助,共建長者友善社區。平日與 家中長輩相處,我們應攙扶他們慢步,而並非毫不體諒地嫌棄他們走得慢,長者需要我們的關心陪伴他們走 過人生餘下的道路。

5E 湯寶俊

在活動中,我們有一部分人作爲義工參與,而不是以學校名義參與,所以我們要負責整個場地的設置,並且分發暫存的物資。在開始時,我們將枱櫈搬到各個已架好的帳幕,並將各個攤位需要用到的獎品由暫存的地方運到攤位。之後,場義工的工作完成後,我們便協助學校攤位蓋印章及補充前台的獎品,最後我們要將所有攤位還原至原本模樣。

我們需要比負責攤位的同學更早到場地做準備工作,而大多都是體力勞動的工作,雖然有手推車的幫助, 但由於有很多的物資需要搬運,所以都算是辛苦的工作。我們都認為這種工作都十分重要,沒有了幕前或幕 後都不能完成,這讓我明白幕前幕後都要有配合才會令事情成功。

活動過後,我開始明白到幫助別人後感到的喜悅是多麼美好,而這種喜悅便會成爲我繼續去嘗試做義工的一份動力。

5D 陸泉廷

是次活動極具意義,能夠與老人家、公公婆婆們互動溝通,一同遊戲,在「樂得者所」之餘同時亦自得其樂。「樂得者所」的目的就是爲長者帶來快樂、充實的社交生活。在今次的活動裡,我們爲長者帶來了「王少清一盅兩件」。這個遊戲的意義就是讓老人家們知道飲食健康的重要性。在設計這個遊戲時,我們特別考慮到長者飲茶時最愛吃的食物及其營養陷阱,把這些食物做成一張張生動的圖像。當公公婆婆選擇這件食物時,我們便會向他們解釋他們的選擇健康與否、需要注意甚麼,希望他們在品嚐佳餚的同時也吃得「有營」健康。當然,在活動途中也遇到一些困難,例如因老人家的聽力問題而難以溝通,但我們都儘量配合,加大聲量,減慢說話速度,他們也很耐心地聽我們解釋,最終問題亦「小事化無」。這次的活動令我學到如何與長者溝通,同時又能爲「樂得者所」出一分力,獲益良多,希望未來再有機會參與類似有意義的活動!

在籌備活動的過程中,我們自己亦能了解更多關於茶樓點心的營養成份,當中包括常見的燒賣腸粉, 其熱量超標,大部分點心容易導致老人家患上慢性病。活動當日我有幸能與屋邨內的老人家聊天,原來 他們當中有些比我們更講究健康,又大方地分享對黑心食品的看法。他們都比我們想像中更健談樂觀,只 是平常我們可能較少有機會接觸和了解他們才不發覺。我亦發現原來大部分老人家到茶樓其實很少選擇點心,反而選擇盅飯,因爲他們認爲「夠飽肚」。他們的胃口甚至比我還大,這是我最意想不到的。

Topic: Child Exploitation and Slavery in the World Today

Setting: Public-Speaking Article for the United Nation Conference

1st Speaker (Mr. Ban)

Good morning ladies and gentlemen, welcome to today's conference on child exploitation and slavery. To commence with, this topic has long been a controversy. In 2016, 168 million children were involved in child slavery, according to UNICEF. These children's basic rights are deprived, worked as factory workers, domestic workers, sex slaves or even involved in harmful and hazardous work. In this day and age, lots of advocates are organizing campaigns and establishing non-government organizations to grapple with the issue, the problem shows no sign of waning.

Child exploitation is a global trend which we must eradicate. However, this trend often happens in poverty-stricken countries and Least Developed Countries (LDCs). They are either being perplexed with natural hazards or having a corrupted administration While the frequent natural hazards cause catastrophic aftermaths, the poor and corrupted governments have no capital and technology for reconstruction. The only thing they can do is to put the issue on the back burner and rely on countries which are capable of offering money for compensation and reconstruction work. Too poor to raise them, families living in the affected areas can only send their children to the relatives living in the capital, where the children can have a better environment and education. To a certain extent, this perpetuates or even worsens the issue of child exploitation.

Some people have a misconception that sending children to the capital can provide them a better life as most of the families there only treat their new family members as domestic helpers, or even send them out to the factories as child labour. Their rights of being educated and good mental well-being are jeopardized, but they could also end up being abused by their relatives. Facing despair and resignation, these children have no hope towards the future and can only accept the reality.

In some ways the administration in these countries tries to solve the problem, but as discussed before, they have little resources to look into the cases. Some of them try to implement laws to prevent inherit child exploitation, but those laws have no power to stem tide of the issue. Finally, the government decides to turn a blind eye to the problem and leave the work to the local non-government organizations, which has less power to act. It is little wonder that such tragedies still persist.

What we are certain of is that the issue has successfully aroused attention throughout the world. Thousands of advocates rise up to combat the issue and collaborate with LDC government. That's why we invited a 12-year-old girl from Cambodia to talk about her struggles of being exploited and Angelina Jolie, the Goodwill ambassador of UN children, to present the work of UN children and its sister organizations. Let's welcome them.

2nd speaker (Linda)

Hi everyone, I am Linda from Cambodia. Today I am going to share with you my early childhood in Cambodia with my stepfamily. I lost my parents at two years old when a devastating earthquake hit my homeland. Ever since then, I have been living with a stepfamily in the capital of Cambodia. I wished they would treat me well, but that was something I could only dream of. The stepfamily treated me badly, or shall I say, treated me as a domestic helper. They made me work all day long: cleaning the kitchen, sweeping the floor, cooking every meal and did all sorts of housework, but this is not the complete picture. As the step-parents already had their own children, I was forced to sleep in the toilet. In the morning, my stepfather would pour cold water on me to wake me up and tell me to make breakfast, and they seldom have leftovers. I could eat nothing but almost starve to death. Sometimes, when I was too hungry, I would go out to find food in the rubbish bins near the house. Eating expired food was just a routine. When all of them had gone out, they would tie me up in the house and lock the door.

Apart from just detaining me up the stepfather hit me whenever he liked to. He would push my head into the wall and

pull my hair. It was so painful that I couldn't help crying, but the louder I cried, the harder he hit me. Sometimes, he would even tell his son to take off my clothes and leave me in the toilet during winter. I couldn't bear the cold as it was adversely freezing during winter in Cambodia. As a result, I often got sick, but whenever this happened, I could neither see the doctor nor take any medicine. They were so cruel if not ruthless and this cast a shadow over my miserable childhood. When most children can live under the unconditional love from their parents, I had no choice but to live with the cruel stepfamily. I had such a strong craving to get rid of this family and do what I wanted. I wished I could go to a local school where I could learn everything about the world and I wished I could wear school uniform every day and run back to school joyfully. I wished I could be a doctor in the future to bail people out of pain, but with my rights to education being deprived, all of these were just wishful thinking. During the years in the capital, I had no friends, no freedom and no hope.

One day, when I was tied up near the window of my house, I saw a group of ladies talking outside. That was the only chance to save myself, so I kept screaming and hitting the window using my head. After several minutes, my efforts paid off as they climbed in from an unlocked window. After hearing my plight, they took me to a local child protection NGO – Cambodian Children's Trust, where they found a child-adopting family. It was the first time I felt love from my home, a real home and I got the freedom to study. The organization changed my life dramatically. Because of them, I could have an opportunity to learn. Because of them, I received support in my teenage years. Because of them, I dare to dream and achieve things I could never imagine. My life had changed from a nightmare to a miracle. That's why today, I am standing here, not only as a victim in the past, but also as a PHD student studying in Harvard. (applause)

Thank you, and now let's turn to a woman who has chosen to lend a helping hand to the children in need and her kindness to participate in this difficult task. She's a leading American actress, who advocates to eradicate child exploitation and has been involved in child protection and educational work for many years. Ladies and gentlemen, please join me in welcoming to this stage our co-host and the UN Child's Global Goodwill Ambassador, Angelina Jolie!

3rd speaker (Angelina Jolie)

(Thank you, Linda, shake hands).

Your excellences, UN Secretary General, President of the General Assembly, Executive Director of UN Children, and distinguished guests. Today we are launching a campaign called 'Children Ain't Slaves' together with our largest sister organization, Cambodian Children's Trust. We hope to stamp out child exploitation and enlist as many advocates as possible to spread the message of 'Children Ain't Salves'. We also aim to protect those who are suffering from exploitation, offering care and education for the future of society.

I am a mother of two lovable children, both of them are energetic and adorable. They have normal lives with friends. They have their own dreams, and full of hope towards the future. What if, they were orphans being abandoned, without the love and care from parents, or even slaves living under fear every day? Many of us grow up under the unconditional love of our parents, but in the poor countries, many of those adorable children are sent to be slaves. They are told to be useless, they don't have the rights to be educated and are abused every day. They lose hope for their future, feeling puzzled about who they are and they feel helpless. Some even end their lives as they don't know what the meaning of life is. This is how devastating child exploitation is. It ruins a child's hope, their fantasy world and their personal development. I believe none of us should let this phenomenon continue to destroy children's lives.

Although children make up just 20% of our population, they are 100% of our future, but before they can support society, we need to offer them care and education, and that's what 'Child Ain't Slaves' is about. Together with Cambodia Children's Trust, we aim to build 100 local schools across the world's poorest countries and recruit teachers from around the world. Up to this day, 52 of the schools have been built and we have already recruited a team of 3000 teachers ready to teach a group of children in the schools. Also, educating adults in poor countries is also important. Through holding talks and assemblies, we hope to impart the correct values of how to treat children well and educate them.

Lastly, I am urging all of you as the UN Child's goodwill ambassadors to cooperate together and eradicate child exploitation. Without your help, the work would be impossible, and let us hope that there will be a day when all children in the world could enjoy freedom and a memorable childhood. Thank you.
