
# 本校網上電子書正式啟動,敬請家長鼓勵子女多善用



# 《如何進入彩虹泡泡中——100 個有趣的數學實驗》

作者:阿爾貝希特·波依特許巴赫(Albrecht Beutelspacher) 譯者:劉岦崱

位於德國吉森的數學博物館,是世界第一個讓遊客動 手做數學的實驗館,館中有各種饒富興味的數學實 驗,如袋鼠拼圖、音樂骰子、混亂鐘擺、消失的孩子、 傳真鏡……等,書中透過 100 個章節,展示各種數學 實驗的操作方式、原理。

生物、物理、化學都須要做實驗,那數學呢? 與一般自然科學實驗截然不同的是,數學實驗透過自己動手與裝置產生互動,像是「破解密碼」、「進入肥皂泡泡中」、「蓋一座橋」……等,並觀察裝置前後的狀態變化,進而重新啓發思考,找回對於數學的熱情!

### 《用 mBlock 玩 Arduino – Starting from Scratch》

#### 作者: 林信良

透過 Arduino 得以興致盎然地重新探索電子電路相關知識,將感動與心得化爲書籍分享。採用基於 Scratch2.0 的 mBlock,圖像式建構程式的方式,對程式設計入門者極爲友善。藉由視覺化程式語言可用元素不多、容易佔據設計空間等問題,來突顯出程式設計的重要設計觀念。採用 ArduinoUno 銜接電子電路元件與模組,有利讀者未來進一步銜接 Arduino 進階書籍。Arduinomode 可直接上傳程式至 Arduino 控制板,亦可將程式匯入 ArduinoIDE 做適當編輯、修改。



### 《舊屋——五十年代九龍寨城》


作者: 陳見宏

一名三歲大,乳名「大眼」的男孩,於一九五三年 隨着家人逃難來港,在九龍寨城居住五年多,本書 是大眼親身經歷的真人真事,包括:街頭賭檔的大 教訓、拾子彈殼的奇遇、跌落屎氹的「災難」等, 全都是現今港孩不可能會遭遇的經歷。

在這五年間,大眼的家還添多了兩名成員。其父親不幸於一九五七年間因交通意外事故受傷,不到一年就過身了。這樣的童年,令他很早就體會到甚麼是快樂,甚麼是悲傷。本書是是香港人的集體回憶,是珍貴的香港歷史,是九龍寨城的歷史,也是賺人熱淚的往事,每一頁都是活生生的人和事,看到人們堅強不撓、真性情、富人情味的一面,亦從旁描書了當日香港之社會面貌,令人懷緬。

書中雖沒有舊照,因舊照片已遺憾地於一場大火中 燒毀,但作者仍盡力還原當日城寨面貌,在書中加 插不少據作者回憶而繪成的插圖,彌足珍貴。

- \* 一年不買包裝商品,學會不再亂花錢!



### Teenage depression and suicide

It is known that students nowadays are suffering from tremendous stress and the unbearable stress is leading to mental illnesses, especially depression. It is a worrying and imminent problem that many teenagers generate suicidal thoughts due to depression and the issue seems to be intensifying gradually. According to research, half of all teenagers in Hong Kong have thought of attempting to commit suicide, which is twice the number of high school students who have suicidal thoughts in North America. Noticing the seriousness of the problem, we cannot turn a blind eye to the issue anymore. There are plenty of measures we can take to save teenagers' invaluable lives. In order to deal with the problem effectively, the first step is to comprehend and investigate the causes contributing to the depression of teenagers.

One of the urgent causes of teenagers' mental illnesses is the stressful exam and schooling system. The schooling system is extremely rigid and a competitive atmosphere is generated at school and even among society. They are both threatening students that if they fail to get outstanding results in the public exam (DSE), they are doomed. As a result, teenagers are striving to give their best in academic performances. However, the cruel truth is that only 20% of senior students taking the public exam will enter the universities every year. This gives students enormous stress and they become more and more fastidious towards their studies and academic achievements. Studying under this intensive education system for a long time, teenagers will undoubtedly be more prone to suffering from stress and even mental illnesses.

Another significant reason leading to teenagers' depression is relationship problems including family relationship, friendship and teenage romance. Relationships with people can be distressing if teenagers fail to handle them properly. There are many reasons behind explaining the issue. For instance, due to hormonal changes, teenagers are more likely to have fluctuating moods and mood swings. This makes communication and getting along with others difficult when teenagers are not in a stable mood. Besides, youngsters are at the stage of adolescence. Teens undergoing this stage of growth are fond of freedom and independence. They may not want to listen to others. As a result, they will fall out with people that have a different point of view to them, especially their families. Some parents place high expectations on their children and always scold and chastise them. It will certainly lead to a worsening of family cohesion. Besides, peer pressure has great impact on teenagers. Since they are not mature enough to handle relationships, adolescents may get hurt when breaking up with friends or lovers easily. All these relationship problems will make teenagers feel frustrated and it may even lead them to have low self-esteem. Feeling lonely, they may generate negative thoughts and suffer from depression.

Actually, they are many methods to help prevent or alleviate the tragic issue. For schools, more lectures should he held to encourage students and advocate the preciousness of lives. Schools can invite people who used to suffer from depression to share their experiences of ways in getting over the hurdle. As a victim of mental illness, the speakers can definitely give proper and useful advice to teens. Since the speakers have similar experiences, their speeches can touch teenagers and sound persuasive to them. It makes them feel like there is someone who will stand by them and understand them.

As for the government, weekly life education lessons can be established as a compulsory programme. Since there are not enough social workers, some troubled youngsters may slip through the cracks. As a result, teens may think that they are not cared for or concerned about. It proves the necessity of life education lessons at school. By organizing life education lessons, the government can assign some professional counsellors to schools, particularly elite schools. Research shows that, 9 out of 10 students studying in elite schools show symptoms of depression. From this, we can see that life education is needed urgently. Youths listening to the professional advice from well-trained counsellors will learn to face adversities and plights optimistically and at least they can learn to associate with others in a friendly manner. It will be practical for teens when they face relationship-related problems. Positivity can also spread to teens in these lessons which will help them combat the feeling of stress and depression.

Last but not least, being a teenager myself, I think people should learn to show acceptance to teens and be aware of teenagers' mental health issues. It is understandable that all parents hope their children perform well at schools. However, family members should not chastise and pressurize youngsters too much on account of academic problems. Instead, family members can show their affection and support to youths when they face academic woes or troubles. Words of encouragement can turn to motivation and happiness of teens and they may become stronger and capable of countering stress and depression.

No teenagers should suffer from tremendous stress or any forms of mental illnesses. All of us have responsibilities on the issue and have to pay efforts in order to alleviate the problem. One report of a teenager suicide is already too much for us to afford. If we keep on ignoring the problem, it will finally get out of hand one day.
