Optimizing Teaching Strategies

Our school strives for excellence and continues this academic year with the “Quality School Improvement Project” supported by a professional team from the Hong Kong Institute of Educational Research (HKIER) at The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK). They provide professional assistance in utilizing data to optimize teaching, promote cross-curricular reading, and enhance English application across subjects. During the Teachers’ Development Day, our principal and various subject teachers shared new ideas on how data analysis can facilitate teaching effectiveness, Reading Across the Curriculum (RAC) and Language-Across-the-Curriculum (LAC) approach. All these can train students’ higher-order thinking skills. This promotes knowledge sharing, professional exchange, and innovative improvement among all teachers. Our school also keeps pace with the times by introducing artificial intelligence and new data analysis systems, enabling the effective implementation of these teaching concepts to enhance our students’ learning outcomes.

Our school library has made use of the funding from the Jockey Club Joy of E-Reading Scheme to purchase e-books for students.

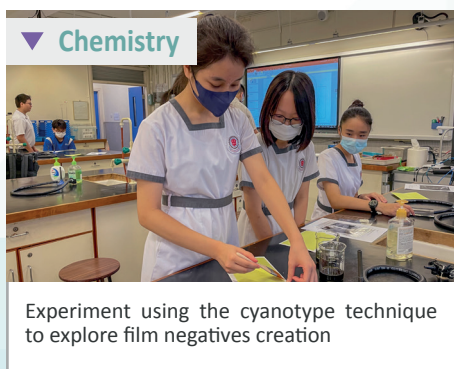


In order to enhance teachers' ability to respond to emergencies, our school held a lecture on “School Crisis Management”.

Learning Through Overseas Exploration

To broaden students' horizons, our school has actively organized multiple overseas exchange programs this academic year, traveling to places such as Beijing, Shaoguan, Inner Mongolia, Taipei, Singapore, and Japan. Each of these programs has its own learning theme related to the curriculum, allowing students to conduct first-hand investigations that reinforce their studies. These experiences not only offer memorable and enriching learning journeys but will also become invaluable assets in their lifelong journeys.

Cultural Exchange and Aerospace Technology

Beijing Study Tour

This has enhanced students' understanding of Chinese history and culture, as well as the development of China's aerospace technology through diverse learning activities, broadening their knowledge of the country and expanding their horizons. At the same time, by establishing a sister school's connection with a prestigious high school in Beijing, friendship and learning between teachers and students from both cities have been fostered and strengthened.

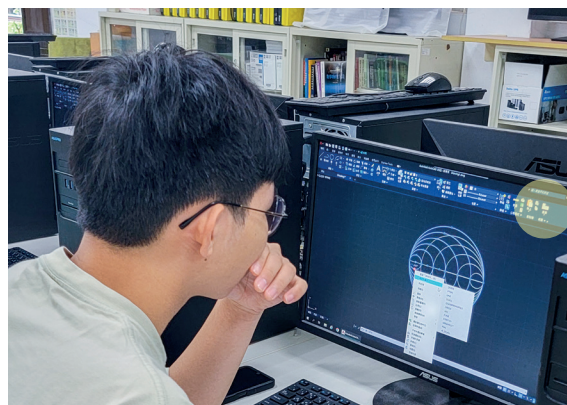

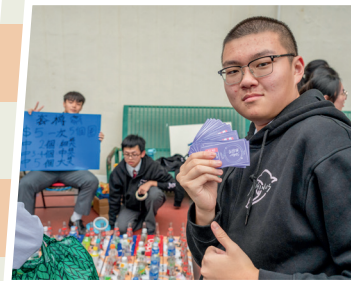

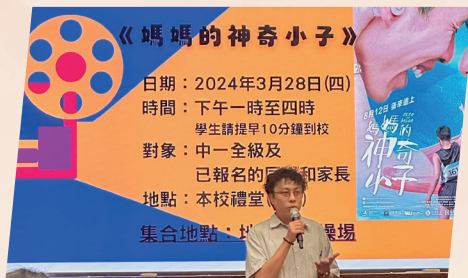

CLAP@JC

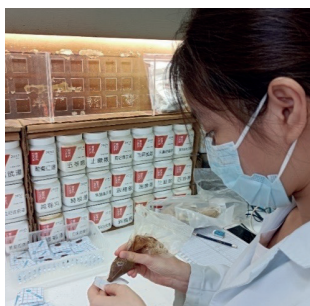
Our school's Careers and Life Planning Unit has continued to be a network school for the "Jockey Club CLAP (Career and Life Adventure Planning) Program," which is organized and funded by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust. This initiative responds to the annual theme of "Positive Education" by strengthening efforts in exploring the meaning of life and personal identity. Additionally, it utilizes the "Hong Kong Benchmarks for Career and Life Development" for evaluation and improvement, guiding the school towards high-quality career planning education that meets international standards. This year, the Life and Career Planning Unit has launched more projects focusing on "Meaningful Encounters with the Workspace" and "Professional Competencies and Leadership".

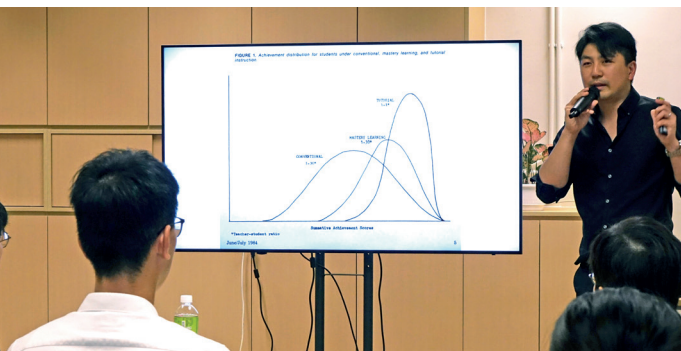

Professional Competencies and Leadership

In addition to professional training for teachers in the Careers and Life Planning Unit, our school also actively communicates with the network schools to optimize life planning education.



In October 2023, Mr. Jovian Ling (Enterprise Advisor of the planned school) (CEO of Set Sail Venture Limited, a Hong Kong start-up company) shared with all teachers how artificial intelligence can be applied in education.

Besides training for teachers, Jovian explained to students how the rapid development of AI would contribute to the trend of future work automation.



With the theme of “Connecting Stakeholders and Improving Life Planning Education—School-based Experience Sharing”, the Careers and Life Planning Unit delivered a public presentation at the “Professional Sharing, Academia Shining Knowledge Fair” organized by the Hong Kong Subsidized Secondary Schools Council.

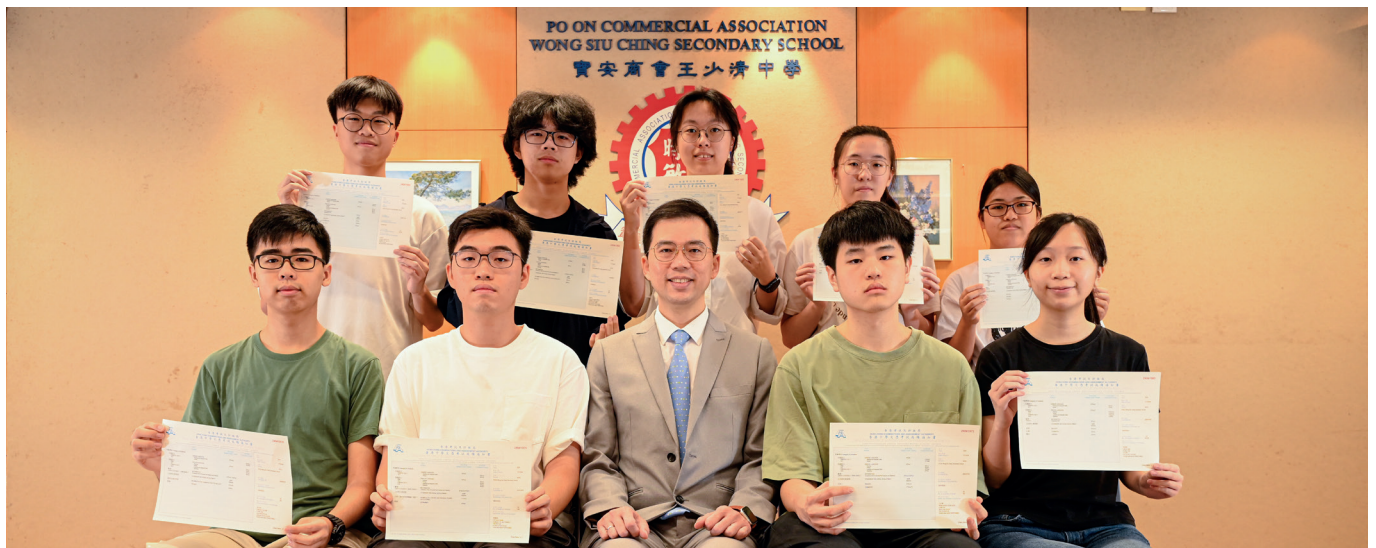

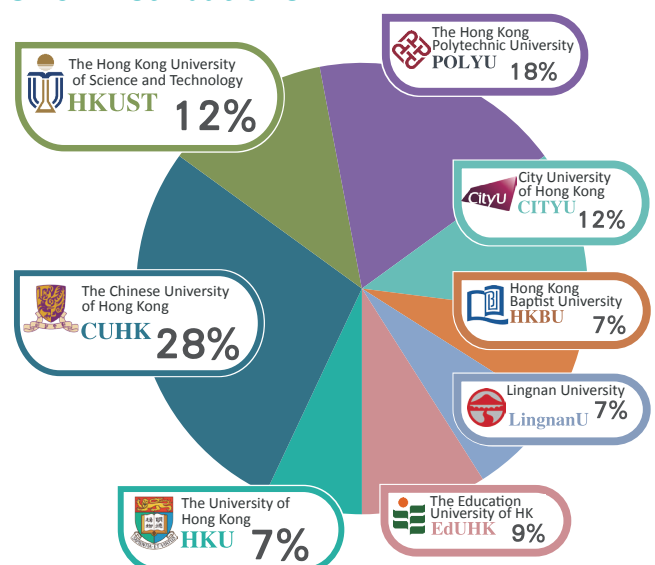


* 86 students were admitted to the JUPAS program, accounting for 82.7%, which was a record high in the past three years, and was also much higher than the average of Hong Kong candidates (50.9%).

* Among students admitted to UGC-funded undergraduate programs, those admitted to the top three universities (HKU, CUHK, and HKUST) accounted for nearly half of those admitted to the eight universities, reaching 47.4%.

* Many students with outstanding performance in the HKDSE were admitted to programs with high admission score thresholds, including Financial Technology at CUHK, Science and Engineering (with an Extended Major in AI) at HKUST, Medical Laboratory Science and Optometry at PolyU.
